Our Architecture Apprenticeship aims to immerse a group of 12-15 ambitious students in grades 9-12 in the world of architectural design and urban planning. The program is structured around:

- Guest lectures from seasoned professionals in the field,
- Educational field trips to significant architectural sites and firms.

- Effective communication and public speaking,
- Initiative and creative problem-solving,

This comprehensive experience is designed to not only enhance the participants' architectural understanding but also to strengthen their work ethic and academic skills, paving the way for success in higher education and beyond.

Responsibilities and Expectations

As the Lead Instructor, you will be instrumental in creating an enriching learning environment that fosters creativity, critical thinking, and practical skill development. **By June 12, 2024**, you are expected to submit a detailed course curriculum that emphasizes student-led learning, reflective practices, and real-world architectural projects. Your role will also involve evaluating students on both their technical abilities and soft skills development, in line with the apprenticeship's overarching objectives.

Collaboration with our staff to arrange motivational guest speakers and organize insightful field trips will be key, ensuring a well-rounded exposure to the architecture profession.

Qualifications

- Must be a declared architecture major (or a closely related field) with extensive subject matter expertise, practical experience, and academic accomplishments.
- Must maintain a strong academic and behavioral record in their current educational institution.
- Demonstrated enthusiasm for mentoring and educating students from urban backgrounds.

LOGISTICS

The apprenticeship program requires Lead Instructors to begin with a staff orientation during the week of <u>June 11 - 14, 2024</u>. Classes will commence on <u>Monday, June 17, 2024</u>, and conclude on <u>July 27, 2024</u>, with an awards ceremony on the final Saturday morning. This role requires a commitment to teach in person, <u>Monday through Friday</u>, from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm at 1819 N Wood St., Chicago, IL 60622.
